5	brief, Phillies are on tonight. One thing I want to
6	share, I know we have through some of the last six
7	meetings or so, people are concerned that they don't see a
8	police officer or how come they are not doing this and how
9	come they are not doing that but I just want to share a
10	few things.
11	And for the month of September we had 240
12	traffic stops. 240. That is an average of eight a day.
13	We wrote 72 citations, tickets and the rest were various
14	warnings for whatever. They could have been someone
15	didn't have a registration sticker showing. There are a
16	lot of things going on, but they are out there. And I
17	just wanted to point that out and it is not always about
18	just writing tickets and nailing every person that is
19	doing something wrong with their vehicle.
20	And I just want to make that it is more
21	about safety and compliance. And a couple myths I want to
22	squash too. So you know if you get a speeding ticket and
23	it happens to be \$165, just so you know, this Borough
24	receives \$12.50 of that.
25	So to think that maybe towards the end of

2 the month the Chief says hey guys/girls, we have to write

3 tickets. It is against the law. We can't have quotas in

4 Pennsylvania. Maybe in other states. I know in

Pennsylvania it is absolutely against the law.

And another thing that I have observed myself, we had a situation a couple Saturdays ago, right? Its been packed on weekends and we had three officers on and they were all on -- we will say a suspected DUI, a

young girl in the back of a car. So one officer has tostay with that car and the parent has to come out and go

12 through a sobriety test.

And in a situation like that, when it is someone in the area -- from the area, the other officer is observing. That person failed the test, allegedly. And it is a situation that takes a minimum of an hour and a half and that person, the suspect, has to be transported to the hospital to get blood taken. It takes up a lot of time. So that is a perfect example on a Saturday afternoon. You think why aren't they doing that.

So Sunday, I just happened to be going from the south end of town coming to my place to open at one and I was delighted and we had an officer -- we only had three officers, it is the most we have on a weekend day. And it was packed this weekend. Anybody that was out

especially on Saturday and Sunday we try to but there is a lot -- it is very crowded downtown and that is -- I think

But I just wanted to get all of that out there so everybody understands that there is -- what you see is not always what it is and that is it. Thank you.
